

ARTIST BIO / STATEMENT

David has been exploring a conceptual investigation of survivors of male on male childhood sexual abuse, their resultant gender identity, sexuality and maladaptive lifestyles.

Using portraiture and text edited from individual interviews of survivors of male on male sexual assault/abuse David tries to present affective insights into a 'narcissistic' eternally liminal state of existence for each survivor manifested in either socially normal or maladaptive life styles. David interviewed survivors and staged their emotional expressions in one hour dive hotels with the intent to give an insightful view of the resultant impact of abuse upon expressions of sexuality, gender and maladaptive lifestyle.





My work is represented in both private and public collections, and published in several books and magazines.





Aging for me has been a slow painful process. I have not been ill or had an accident. Nothing major has occurred, just the slow process of decay. Currently 72 — April 3 is my birthday — I grapple with death, a recurring theme in my life. With one bout of major depression in my life for a year and a half when I was 22-24, the scar of this event has never left. Add to that scar growing up homosexual in a time when it was still a diagnosis, before 1973 when the APA took it out of the DSM. I have struggled with the question: am I good enough, man enough in a world that has hated me. Male Jewish White Gay Privileged American now toward the end of my life, the final 1/3, the finale, not so grand.

I photograph myself struggling to make sense of me, now 'A Stranger in a Strange Land.' Grokking where I've been, HELL. 'Selfieing' myself with 3 cameras — the one on my iPhone 6S, my Canon point and shoot and my DSLR 7OD — documenting the pains and joys of the simple home existence of my life through the use of selfie sticks, delayed shutter, tripods, backdrops, lighting and more. Here I introduce NKA Dove Nasir, an aging content and malcontent 'mjwgpa' cisgender human from CKA (currently known as) Earth. Documenting glimpses of his home, 3 rooms, his life in play and torment, his memoir in pictures...in an Ed McMahon intro, ""Here's Dove!""


